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A. Call to Order

Ms. Cindi Nannetti called the meeting to order at 1:10 p.m.

B. Welcome/Introductions

Ms. Nannetti requested introductions by all present.

C. Minutes

Ms. Marilyn Seymann motioned to approve minutes as stated. Mr. Shaun Rieve seconded. Motion passed.

D. Commission Event Proposal

Ms. Nannetti expressed interest in recruiting a nationally recognized speaker to lead a symposium on trauma informed care. Committee members agreed to recruit one speaker to present from a national perspective, with the condition that a future event could be devoted to local presenters. It was determined that once a date is committed by the speaker, a venue will be selected to hold the symposium. Details of the event, including the estimated cost, will be presented to the Executive Committee.

E. Commission Outreach Efforts

Mr. Steve Selover provided brochure templates used by the other Governor's Office of Youth, Faith and Family boards and commissions. Ms. Helen Gandara advised the biggest

challenge she notices coming from the community is the lack of understanding of the juvenile court system. Members of the Committee acknowledged many law enforcement and public citizens are unaware of the rights juveniles have, the terminology and the flow of the system. Therefore, the Committee members agreed that the best use of a brochure created by the AJJC is to include information that helps parents navigate the juvenile court system. It was decided that this guide will be easy for non-juvenile justice professionals to understand and be available in Spanish. This proposal will be presented to the Executive Committee and will include an estimate of the expense associated with development and production of the brochure.
